COMPOSTING

Did you know food scraps comprise nearly 30% of waste sent to the landfill? <u>Reduce</u> the cost of waste hauling services by composting! Composting is easy, low cost, and will produce a nutrient rich fertilizer for your garden or lawn! There are several composting bins available on the market. Pick the one that fits your needs best, but be sure that it is made out of sturdy material such as wood or plastic. You can even choose to build one!

Ask your local hardware store for tips on constructing a DIY compost bin,. Your compost will need to be turned from time to time to distribute the heat and moisture. After the food waste has properly decomposed, you will have a rich nutrient fertilizer to apply to your garden! Composting saves money on fertilizer!

Composting don'ts Don't add raw meats or bones to your compost. Don't add dairy products Don't add human or pet wastes Don't add diseased plants

Composting do's:

Compost requires a ratio balance between Carbon (C) and Nitrogen (N) rich materials. The ideal C:N ratio is 30:1. Materials rich in carbon are: wood ashes, shredded cardboard, corn stalks, leaves, shredded newspaper/paper, peanut shells, pine needles, or sawdust. Materials rich in nitrogen include: coffee grounds, food waste (cooked meats included), grass clippings, and vegetable scraps. With a little research and practice, you could be on your way to reducing your waste hauling fee and becoming more environmentally sustainable!

What you can do to help.

Reduce: Make Less Trash!
